With the year 2020 nearly behind us, some of us may feel a sense of relief, others gratitude for having endured these very unprecedented times. For clients like "Emily," the statewide eviction moratorium was only a temporary solution for an eventual eviction case filed by her landlord.

How can you shelter in place, if your shelter is at risk?

A LAW attorney helped Emily by explaining to her that she could ask for a 60-day postponement of her pending eviction hearing. With this breathing room, Emily was able to find and ultimately move into alternate housing. Although there were many variables at play in the ultimate fate of our resilient client, Emily, the landlord failed to appear at the last court hearing and the eviction case against her was dismissed!

LAW champions fairness by advocating for those with the least access to the civil justice system.
